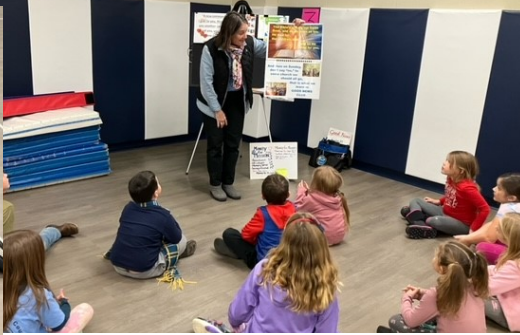


A Look at Some of the Good News Clubs

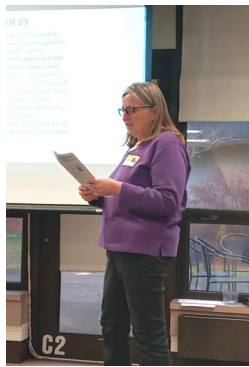
